Objects of the charity: The objectives of the society are stated in the constitution. These

are 1) to educate the public in the art and science of music in all its aspects by the presentation of concerts and other activities and 2) such other charitable purposes as the committee may from time to

time decide.

Powers of the trustees: The powers of the trustees are defined as follows:

a raising funds, selling tickets for concerts and inviting contributions, provided that in raising funds the committee shall not undertake any substantial permanent trading activities and shall conform to any relevant requirements of

the law.

- b buying, taking on lease or in exchange any property necessary for the achievement of the objectives, and maintaining it and equipping it for use.
- c borrowing money and charging all or part of the property of the society with repayment of the money so borrowed, subject to any consents required by law.
- d hiring and paying professional musicians and employing such staff (who are not members of the society) as are necessary for the proper pursuit of the objectives.
- e co-operating with other charities, voluntary bodies and statutory authorities operating in furtherance of the objectives or of similar charitable purposes, and exchanging information and advice with them.
- f establishing or supporting any charitable trusts, associations or institutions formed for all or any of the objectives.
- g appointing and constituting such advisory committees as the management committee shall think fit.
- h doing all such other lawful things as are necessary for the achievement of the objectives.

Main activities undertaken:

The formal objectives of the Henley Symphony Orchestra have been described above. The orchestra aims to bring live music to the local community and to provide musical education to its members.

The orchestra rehearses weekly at Henley College with a professional Musical Director.

Concert venues include Christ Church in Henley-on-Thames and the Concert Hall and the Hexagon in Reading. At least four concerts are given annually.

The orchestra gives concerts, by invitation, in Henley's twin towns of Leichlingen, Germany, and Falaise, France

#### Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

This report covers the 2020-21 concert season, from September 2020 to July 2021.

In the 2020 –21 season, the orchestra gave:

- One public concert in the UK, but
- Four concerts and the Open Evening were cancelled due to COVID pandemic.

2020-21 is the twenty-sixth year under the musical direction of lan Brown.

The COVID pandemic sadly disrupted the majority of this last year, and we had to cancel our planned concerts in November, December and March, our Open Evening in May, and the Henley Festival concert in July.

The orchestra made a valiant attempt to return to rehearsing using ZOOM in the Spring of 2021, although this involved playing individually on mute, while David Burton (for the strings) and Ian Brown (for the wind) provided direction and some accompaniment, before we were finally able to return to rehearsing in May and June. It was with great joy that we were able to perform our delayed June concert on 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2021 in Christ Church Henley, playing with a reduced orchestra and featuring the local young soprano, Elenor Vockins singing three arias for soprano and orchestra.

A full orchestra programme has been prepared for the 2021-22 season, and the orchestra hopes to develop and to gain valuable knowledge and ability through lan's guidance and encouragement, and to expand its repertoire and tackle more demanding works. The standard of the playing of the orchestra continues at a high level. The orchestra has travelled several times to the twin towns of Henley in France and Germany, and Slovenia. The orchestra has returned to return to rehearsing and performing in Autumn 2021.

#### **Financial Review**

Reserves policy: To maintain reserves equivalent to one year's running costs.

Further financial details: The accounts of the society for the financial year 2020 / 2021 are

appended to this report.

The assets owned by the society include a full set of timpani and other requirements such as lighting. There is no major expenditure required

for further, or replacement equipment, in the near future.

### **Treasurer's Report**

This was a very unusual financial year due to the covid pandemic and the resulting cancellation of all the planned concerts. There was no ticket income but correspondingly costs were much lower as no concerts took place. However, overheads still had to be covered and retainers were paid to our conductor and leader. The charity was extremely grateful to members and friends who were able to continue to support us financially during this unprecedented time.

Henley Symphony Orchestra Productions Ltd (HSOP), registered company number 11957773, was set up in 2019 with two members of the orchestra committee (trustees) as directors of the company, to take advance of HMRC's Orchestra Tax Relief scheme. The orchestra pays an annual commissioning fee to this subsidiary company covering the costs of putting on concerts, while concert income is retained by the orchestra. This allows the company to claim a rebate of corporation tax on the loss it makes, which is then returned to the orchestra. Although no concerts actually took place in the current financial year, HMRC allowed some expenditure for cancelled concerts to be included in the tax rebate calculation, and the tax reclaimed for the 2020-21 season of concerts was £440.

The orchestra's assets had increased by £5713 at the end of the financial year due to the generous support of friends and members, and this small surplus was very much needed when the orchestra returned to performances but with reduced audience numbers so less possibility of breaking even. In cash terms, the orchestra ended the financial year with approximately £10,000 more in the bank than at the start of the year, due to the payment of the Orchestra Tax Relief claim for the previous year and the fact that the low level of expenditure meant that there was a relatively small amount of tax relief owed to the orchestra for the current year's claim.

Due to the lower level of income for the financial year, which was well under £25,000 for the first time in many years, no independent examination of the accounts was required.
